




Experience working in a major trauma centre

Work in a newly re-designed environment

Our state-of-the-art re-development at Charing Cross Hospital increases our number of 'majors' cubicles to 15 and the number of resuscitation bays to eight. The £8 million project follows hot on the heels of a similar re-development at St Mary's Hospital.

"The best thing about the emergency department is working with this team. They are like my family and it's the best team you could ever find. They can tell if I'm ever feeling down and they'll pep me up and keep me going, and that's one of the main reasons why I've been here for 20 years.

When you've proven your competency in your job and there's a strong team around you, there's nothing to fear – even when confronted with something that's unexpected such as a major incident. Every major incident I've ever been involved in has run completely to plan. And that's because everyone knows their job and they know what's needed at any particular moment.

Every registrar will have a consultant appointed to them. We encourage our registrars to show their competencies across a wide range of specialties. We all have very different interests and we always try to encourage whatever special interests our junior and middle grade doctors have."
